- **Scientist.**
- Born in Poland in 1867.
- Moved to Paris to study.
- She married Pierre Curie (a scientist).

Marie discovered **radium** and **polonium** for cancer treatment.

During WW1, Marie Curie invented **x-ray machines** ('Mini Curies') that could travel.

Marie Curie is the only woman to have received 2 **Nobel Prizes**.

- **Scientist.**
- Born in the United States of America 1892.
- Died at the age of 24.

Alice discovered oil from the **chaulmoogra tree** could help cure **leprosy**.

The Windrush Movement

People from Caribbean countries were invited to the United Kingdom to work.

After WW2, the country needed more workers to help rebuild the country.

They arrived in England in 1948 on the boat HMT Empire Windrush.
